14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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According to the Florida after 3PM (2020) report, the demand for afterschool programs is strong, with over 1.5 million Florida children who would have participated in an afterschool program had it been available to them. Additionally, the hours between 3 and 6 p.m. are peak hours for juvenile crime and experimentation with drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, and sex, highlighting the need for a safe space for children to go after school. The goal of this program is to provide Florida youth with a safe place to be after the school day; caring adults; and warm meal while providing them with academic support; extracurricular opportunities; and positive adult role models, all in an effort to break the cycle of poverty for future generations.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The services to be provided include academic enrichment opportunities during afterschool and summer programming, including, but not limited to, tutoring and mentoring; homework help; academic enrichment; college and career readiness; service learning; physical fitness; health and wellness; as well as music, arts, sports and cultural activities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Florida's Boys & Girls Clubs work with school-age children and youth during afterschool and summer programs by providing activities that reinforce and enhance school day learning. These programs encompass a broad range of focus areas including academic support; mentoring; personal enrichment; the arts; sports and recreation; and apprenticeships and workforce development programs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

More than 1,000 school-age (kindergarten through twelfth grade) children will receive high-quality afterschool programming.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Boys & Girls Clubs provide structured, supervised programming outside of school hours for school-aged children and teens by providing academic support; mentoring; youth development; exposure to the arts; and sports and recreation. These programs can benefit each participant, but there are additional benefits of afterschool programs for working families as they provide a safe place for children after school while their parents work. The methodology by which this outcome will be measured is through program evaluation and attendance.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

A complete Corrective Action Plan set by the Department of Education and a reduction of funds.
