4. Project/Program Description

Clay County entered into a joint maintenance agreement with FDOT in 1996 to maintain the recreational bike trail known as Black Creek Bike Trail. The Construction and Maintenance Agreement was entered into in 2011, acknowledging that DEP would construct the 8 mile paved trail and the County would maintain and make repairs. This trail has 3 wooden boardwalk sections that are in need of replacement. These sections are 3200 ft, 180 ft, and 210 ft long with handrails. The County seeks to replace the stringers, decking, and handrails in these three sections with composite wood.

This trail has 3 wooden boardwalk sections that are in need of replacement. These sections are 3200 ft, 180 ft, and 210 ft long with handrails. The wood sections have become weathered and pose risks to pedestrians who utilize this trail for walking, running, and cycling. The County seeks to replace the stringers, decking, and handrails in these three sections with composite wood.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



Remove existing boardwalk and replace with environmentally safe and sustainable composite wood.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Replacing the natural wood boards with composite wood will create safe access to the Black Creek Bike Trail over the 3 wooden boardwalks.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All of Clay County, Florida (population 218,245)

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Bike path mitigation upgrades boards from natural wood to a composite material, creating a safer experience within the Black Creek Bike Trail.
