a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Increase usable width of CR209 roadway. Reduce related vehicle crashes/deaths, especially in curved areas. Provide a pathway for bicycles to safely travel, connecting residential neighborhoods to commerce. Allow disabled vehicles more room to avoid traffic. Allow a vehicle that does wander out of a travel lane an opportunity to recover while on pavement. Avoid head-on collisions.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The widened roads will provide safer transportation through the County by citizens and visitors, based on a CR-209 Intersection Scoping Study previously completed.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The roads will increase safety and mobility for all County residents.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Will serve a countywide benefit and directly serve the residents of Lake Asbury (approx. 8,700 individuals).

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reduced travel times, less accidents, and fewer fatalities per vehicle mile traveled.
