a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The aim of this project is to develop a top-notch residential facility that offers around-the-clock care for adults with neurological disorders. This facility is designed specifically for individuals with motor disabilities, and it will provide them with structured activities, social interaction, and other opportunities that enhance their quality of life. The programs and care provided at the residential homes will be an extension of CECO's center-based day programs. The care offered through this initiative will also benefit the family members of the individuals by providing them with a sense of peace and reassurance. It is vital to establish a community where people with motor disabilities can reside, learn, and work. Currently, no such community exists that provides all these elements in one property. Also, the funds will be used to execute an interior modification, and to renovate a newly purchased building.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction related works, such as pre-construction activities involving inspections, architectural and engineering development, electrical and plumbing plans, and environmental inspections. Site preparation, and foundation creation of the new facility. Furthermore, the funds will be spent on purchasing necessary materials for the interior alteration of the existing building. These include drywall, paints, flooring materials, doors.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Educational, therapeutic, life-skill, educational rehabilitation program, recreational, after school services, 24/7 care, medical services, social services, and personal care services for individuals with neurological disorders.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is adults and children with neurological disorders. 100-200 per year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The outcome of this project will be a residential facility that caters to individuals with neurological disorders. The facility will provide spacious rooms, modern and accessible kitchens, bathrooms, and outdoor space with specific furniture and equipment. It will be staffed with registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, specially trained caregivers, and life-skill specialists. Additionally, residents can access CECO-trained assistants, life-skill specialists, and conductive education instructors, and reduce the burdens on the state by occupying the existing space. Families will have an access to a high quality program that is specifically structured and developed for their loved ones with neurological disorders. Currently, CECO serves 100 families per year. Each of our programs have a wait list and families move from other states and countries to be part of the program. The educational building would allow us to increase enrollment and open new classrooms.
