14. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Receiving the \$500,000.00 will ease the burden of covering unanticipated tenant improvements and qualifying for the amount of money being financed. The total project is approximately 3,800.000.00. This will help the school stay within their affordability and offset any other unexpected costs during the renovation of the building.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Once Language & Literacy is relocated in the new building, specifically designed instruction, therapeutic activities, behavioral health services, mental health services, and other rehabilitative/restorative practices will continue for the 350 students & families we serve.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

We provide services according to each student's Individual Education Plan which includes physical, occupational, speech & language therapies, registered behavior tech services, mental health services, social work, guidance counseling, and direct instruction in all academic areas. We cater to students with ADHD and Autism; however, we also serve a population of students who require intensive behavior supports due to severe behavior and mental health disorders. We provide transportation across the entire Polk County area, not just Winter Haven.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is any student who has an Individual Family Service Plan or an Individual Education Plan. Students can enroll as early as 12 months and do not have to withdraw until they have reached the age of 21. We expect to continue serving 350+ annually through the first 2-3 years. After which, we plan to expand and serve up to 500 students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is to relocate Language & Literacy Academy to the new location at the start of the 2024-2025 school year. The expected benefit is to have a safe place that is conducive to learning for the students and a pleasant workspace for the staff. For me, the Principal, I will not have to worry about another organization purchasing a building from us. This will create an environment of stability for all of the stakeholders. The uncertainty from staff will decrease and this will reduce staff attrition and turnover rates. We will also see increased and steady enrollment with families so they don't have to also worry about having a place for their child to go to school.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If we are unable to qualify for the full amount of financing for this project, we will not have a place to relocate 350 families at the beginning of the 2024-2025 school year. At the time of the search, this was the best option for ownership. The advantage of this project, after 20 years, the facility will be bonded back to the organization. This will allow Language & Literacy to be sustained with or without the current leadership.
