Palm Beach County is the recipient of CARES US Treasury funds in the amount of \$261 million. Funding was spent entirely on emergency assistance, mortgage assistance, business grants, COVID-19 sheltering, testing and isolation, as well as on emergency personnel. Palm Beach County also received approximately \$290 million in American Rescue Plan Funding for pandemic-related service and infrastructure projects.

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A community justice approach mobilizes law enforcement, community leaders, and other systems to provide an alternative, community-based solution to arresting individuals dealing with mental health, opioid, fentanyl, and other debilitating drug abuse issues. The goal is to prevent these individuals from cycling through the criminal justice system. This is achieved by providing immediate stabilizing services through targeted case management, peer mentoring, housing, treatment, and employment.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Community leadership and coordination, case management, peer mentoring, counseling, housing assistance, employment assistance, and substance use disorder treatment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Provide an alternative, community-based solution to arresting individuals dealing with mental health, opioid, fentanyl, and other debilitating drug abuse issues. This can be achieved by providing immediate stabilizing services through targeted case management, peer mentoring, housing, treatment, and employment, thus preventing them from recycling through the criminal justice system.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Persons with poor mental and physical health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, the homeless, drug users, currently or formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders, and victims of crime. Approximately 100 individuals will be served as part of this new program with the intention to expand later upon determination of the program's efficacy.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

We expect to see an improvement in mental and physical well-being of participants through increased access to services. This will be measured by analyzing data regarding the number of individuals served as well as recovery and recidivism rates.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
