We aim to equip students, community members and small businesses with essential skills and provide access to the tools needed to thrive in a competitive job market by leveraging AI technologies. We deliver training workshops that will enhance the job-market competitiveness of the participants, set up state-of-the-art AI software and equipment within our learning spaces and forge partnerships with local businesses to disseminate innovative AI-based solutions for workforce development.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities include faculty and staff professional development, course development for AI Tools for Small Businesses, integration of Simucase into Social Work curriculum, student training and workshops for community members using Vmock platform and VR-based training for nursing students and practitioners.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services include AI-based assistance with resumes, video mock interviews LinkedIn profiles and elevator pitches using VMock SMART platform delivered to students and community. We will conduct Office 365 Workshops and access to software for community and small business owners. We will train Social Work students and practitioners using the Simucast platform and train Nursing students and practitioners.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Students and local small businesses will be served with this project. The quantity of individuals is not yet determined.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

For students, a system will be put into place to analyze learners' competence, confidence, and readiness to apply Albased tools in their respective fields through:

- Pre- and post-training assessment
- Instructor evaluation
