Training young adults with autism to enhance their skills and confidence in the areas of independent living, career exploration, and social competency while preparing them for various situations to ensure safety including interactions with police officers. Progress toward these skills may vary based on the participant's unique abilities and interests which will be addressed through technology and expanded collaborations with health and wellness, education, police, and business partners.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

An immersive community-based program to foster personal and professional growth; Training participants and police officers to promote positive and safe interactions; Service delivery at multiple sites for greater access to workshops, life and career coaching, certificate programs, and social events relevant to career exploration, social skills and independent living.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Certification program with workforce skills to pursue a diverse career path including opportunities to start new businesses; 1:1 sessions on social competency, career exploration, and independent living; General sessions on interviewing, self-advocacy skills, social competency, conflict resolution, and positive police interactions; Skill reinforcement through the utilization of technology tools.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

101-200 individuals; Target population includes: Jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, developmentally disabled, physically disabled, University/College students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

BENEFIT: Improve physical health; METHODOLOGY: YMCA attendance records; annual satisfaction and health improvement surveys.
