4. Project/Program Description

Community Legal Services is a legal aid that has served within in the mid-Florida region since 1966. Under the federal guidelines given to us by our primary funder, the Legal Services Corporation, we are only able to serve those below the 200% federal poverty level. Many working-class Floridians earn too much to qualify for our services, yet do not make enough to afford an attorney.

The requested funds will be used to promote, support, and provide legal services to those with income up to 400% of the poverty level, broadening the reach of legal aid services to individuals who often do not meet standard income requirements but will experience financial hardship by hiring an attorney to address a legal concern. Funds will support the goal to close this "Justice Gap" through development of a sustainable model that can serve more individuals in our 12-county service area (Brevard, Citrus, Flagler, Hernando, Lake, Marion, Orange, Osceola, Putnam, Seminole, Sumter, and Volusia).

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will be used to promote, support, and provide legal services to those with income up to 400% of the poverty level, broadening the reach of legal aid services to individuals who often do not meet standard income requirements but will experience financial hardship by hiring an attorney to address a legal concern. Funds will support the goal to close this "Justice Gap" through development of a sustainable model that can serve more individuals in our 12-county service area.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will be used to provide a range of legal services to citizens with income up to 400% of the poverty level. These legal services will span multiple areas of civil law, and will be provided virtually and in-person to reach the greatest number of community members. Additionally, funds may be utilized for marketing and outreach purposes to promote our civil legal aid services.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services that will be provided to citizens with the funding requested may include provision of legal advice/brief services, pro se pleadings for clients to file, or extended services and full representation. Additionally, funds will be used to support and promote the firm's services which may include marketing and outreach efforts to expand access to civil legal aid services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served will be those below the 400% federal poverty level between the 200% and 400% federal poverty level range. We expect to serve 400-800 people directly with the requested funds.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The expected outcome is increased access to lawyers for working class Floridians within our 12-county service area who make too much to qualify for legal aid, but not enough to afford an attorney. We will track clients coming in who fall between the 200%-400% federal poverty who we were able to serve due to this funding.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Should Community Legal Services (CLS) fail to meet deliverables or performance measures set forth in a contract resulting from the appropriation of funds for this project, CLS agrees to return any funding that is not utilized or underutilized to the selected source agency.
