 911 Inform technology that transmits detailed geofence data to law enforcement and increases accuracy of emergency responses
 License plate readers at all entrances to the 19 community facilities to identify potential threats
 Trauma kits and AED devices for all 19 facilities including tourniquets, bandages, and other tools to mitigate injuries for victims in violent crimes and emergencies
 Firearm detection software to prevent attacks combined with active shooter drills and CPR training

Increased security, using enhanced technology, to prevent and detect anti-Semitic acts, terrorism, active shooters, firearms, and broad emergency preparedness for vulnerable Jewish facilities and the individuals they serve in Northeast Florida. By layering notification and security technology first responders will have full situational awareness for active scenes, faster response to emergencies and ultimately save lives.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Installation of an appropriate set of security systems will enhance collaboration with law enforcement and ability to respond to active shooters, acts of terrorism and other emergencies throughout the communities served by 19 facilities. AEDs and trauma kits will ensure the availability of necessary supplies to respond to on-site emergencies in a timely and effective manner.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

By enhancing security of the 19 facilities throughout the Northeast FL region through the methods outlined above, citizens will have more access to programs and services provided. Law enforcement will be immediately notified active shooters, acts of terrorism, etc., and they will be able to prepare for such emergencies in in a more comprehensive way.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The general population of the greater Jacksonville area including, but not limited to, Jewish families and individuals served by 19 facilities across three counties. The project is expected to serve more than a thousand individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve overall safety and security of religious facilities and community spaces in and around Jacksonville to be measured by the number of violent incidents and the outcomes of each. Enrich cultural experiences and protect access to cultural events to be measured by attendance of cultural events provided by facilities in the region.

Should state funded projects not meet the to-be-determined benchmarks, the Jewish Federation of Northeast Florida will establish a repayment plan to return the funds to the state agency.
