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JSA's Vocational STEP Program provides students with job seeking skills, job development and placement, functional daily living and social skills, and employment coaching. Funding will be used to develop and expand on-campus enterprises where the skills and interests of the students are aligned with professional job skills to meet the individual's ability and overcome disabilities. JSA also provides on-campus and community-based vocational opportunities with strategic community partnerships.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

JSA seeks funding to create a holistic transition initiative. This initiative encompasses several key components: expanding JSA's vocational enterprises to accommodate a larger number of students, establishing a practical daily living skills curriculum, introducing a social and leisure program, and procuring essential equipment to support students in both classroom and community settings.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The STEP program extends its services to a diverse range of local businesses, encompassing tasks such as confidential shredding, sourcing locally-grown produce, engaging in screen printing, creating beautiful art pieces, culinary experiences and more. Our program focuses on fostering independence and enhancing the contributions of individuals with autism beyond the school system.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The group of people that this project will serve are students age 14 to adulthood. Program participants include current pre-vocation and vocation students at JSA as well as post-secondary students from other private and public programs. JSA serves populations of individuals with autism spectrum disorders (ASD). We enroll individuals from the surrounding counties of Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns. Our current placement of families crosses all ethnicities and economic backgrounds; autism does not discriminate by whose lives are impacted!

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of JSA's Vocational STEP Program is to essentially provide our vocational students with more and more job opportunities, supportive employment placements, and on-campus job enterprises. Our students and young adults have the skills necessary to be successful and productive members in both their home and community; we just need to provide additional resources for them to be able to THRIVE! JSA uses Excel to track skill development over multiple job coaching environments.
