Boley received a Paycheck Protection Payment grant in 2020 for \$1.7M and more recently ARPA funding through the City of St. Pete. to operate an Intensive Case Management program to serve our homeless population (\$500K). The PPP grant was to ensure we kept staff on the payroll. Neither of these funding sources assisted with offsetting loss of funding experienced during the pandemic.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose is to address the critical needs of individuals with serious mental illness by improving the infrastructure and building safety of our psychosocial rehabilitation & work readiness programs. Goals will be to create a safer & more conducive therapeutic environment, increase the capacity served, improve the quality of services, reduce recidivism in crisis systems, and promote recovery, independence, and reintegration into the community for those with serious mental illness.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Individuals with serious mental illness, many with co-occuring substance use disorders, criminal justice involvement, and housing instability. 400-600 per year.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

- 1) Increased access and engagement with primary medical care measured by decreased 911 calls, telehealth appointments, and linkage to primary medical care
- 2) Improved mental health functioning and decreased suicidal risk levels as measured by increased scores from the DLA-20 assessment instrument and decreased PHQ-9 scores
- 3) Increase client income, health insurance, and food stamp assistance to improve self-sufficiency as measured by increased income and access to health & financial assistance income.
- 4) Reduced use of crisis stabilization units and county jail due to housing instability, increased access to mental health & work readiness services, and a path to permanent housing as measured by engagement in services, transitions to housing, work readiness skills, and increased functioning levels.
- 5) Reduced substance use as measured by reduced incarcerations, increased participation in treatment services, and housing stability.
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?



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The organization or project might face a reduction in funding or withholding of future installments if predefined milestones or performance metrics are not achieved. The funding agency could reassess the allocation of funds based on the organization's failure to meet agreed-upon goals, potentially reducing the amount of capital appropriation for the project. The organization may also be required to repay a portion of the received funds due to performance.
