### The Florida Senate Local Funding Initiative Request Fiscal Year 2024-2025

Pinellas Park Roadway and Intersection Improvements - 60th Street/Park

This is a local transportation improvements project. The City of Pinellas Park is proposing to make roadway improvements

and install a traffic signal at the intersection of Park Boulevard (State Road 694) and 60th Street, North. The intersection is part of the City Center's Park Station District which is centrally located within Pinellas County and the Tampa Bay region. The intersection of Park Boulevard and 60th Street North is the keystone to successfully implementing the City Center plan. Pinellas Park already budgeted for a Public Safety Campus at the southeast corner of 60th Street North. and 78th Avenue

### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Pinellas Park has budgeted for a Public Safety Campus at the southeast corner of 60th Street North and 78th Avenue North. It will house the City's Police Department, Fire Administration, and Fire Station #35. The specific goals are to make roadway and intersection improvements that will allow first responders to access areas of the City south of Park Boulevard safely and efficiently, reduce emergency response times, improve traffic flow, improve mobility patterns for bicyclists/pedestrians, and reduce the number of crashes with serious injury.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

In order to achieve the intended outcomes, the City of Pinellas Park will conduct roadway improvements that include removal of the existing HAWK pedestrian crossing signal, installation of a new electronic traffic signal, curbing, landscaping, paving, sidewalks and concrete.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Park Boulevard serves as a main east/west thoroughfare from Tampa to the Gulf Beaches communities. The proposed traffic signal will provide multi-modal road users from several jurisdictions safer mobility.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted populations for this project are residents and workers who regularly traverse this area.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Multi-modal road users and persons in need of emergency services will be the primary benefactors of the proposed project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Agencies that contract with the City are required to purchase surety bonds at 100% of the cost of the project. Payments may be held pending the satisfactory achievement of performance measures or deliverables.
