Funds will be set aside to pay additional sheriff deputies and/or security guards to maintain a police presence in the area that can deter criminal activities. The program will pay for their salaries and benefits. The program will also pay the expenses of a neighborhood crime watch/citizen on patrol effort. \$50,000 is included in this line for that effort.	350,000

Construction/Renovation/Land/ Planning Engineering	Funds will be used to remove trash and tires dumped in the area. Keeping the area clean will discourage people from dumping trash, debris, and tires in the area as is currently the case. Other funds will be used to provide home improvement for the residents of the community.	80,000

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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal for these funds is to reduce crime in a residential area of unincorporated Palm Beach County utilizing a variety of crime prevention tools. The area includes 12,549 residents with an average household income of approximately \$34,980. A variety of strategies will be implemented including the installation of additional street lights throughout the residential neighborhoods, security cameras, security officers/deputies, graffiti removal, & resources for a neighborhood crime watch.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used to install and maintain additional street lighting in residential crime-ridden neighborhoods, install security cameras in key locations, establish a neighborhood watch, contract with security guards and/or deputies to provide public safety services, safety signage, remove graffiti and dumped trash, and establish a grant program for owners to improve the face of their property.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Residents will receive access to funds to improve their properties through a new grant program, increased safety and security through the services provided by public safety officials and a new neighborhood watch, and community beautification through the removal of graffiti and illegally dumped waste.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population being served by this project is the 12,549 residents of the Westgate Belvedere Homes CRA whose mean household income is \$34,980.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

It is expected that these improvements will reduce blight, increase safety and security, revitalize the community, and improve economic activity in the area. Crime data will be collected and analyzed, the number of participating owners in the grant program will indicate need and impact, a survey of businesses will be conducted to determine any increases in economic activity.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
