The project will also increase tourism by improving the management of Lake County's extensive lakes and waterways which will improve water quality, provide for treatment of invasive aquatic weed management, improved navigation, and monitoring. The outcome will be measured by water quality testing, waterway access, complaints to FWC on boating related issues, as well as vehicle counters at County maintained ramps and Tourism numbers for boating related events.
