CARES Act: \$105M for public safety needs & economic support; \$20.4M for transit, housing, fire rescue, Valkaria Airport, & Sheriff's community programs: \$32.6M for emergency rental assistance; \$6.6M for HUD Programs, \$4.2M for housing programs; \$3M for transit.

14. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The appropriations request would allow the county to advance pre-construction activities with clearing and grubbing to facilitate utility relocation and provide additional ROW acquisition funding as a safeguard against the rising inflation and unexpected increases in property appraisals. This would reduce the overall construction cost in the future, accelerate the project's schedule, and help secure project delivery. This project widens the innovation and economic corridor (IEC) for the Space Coast region, which is considered a hotbed for the aerospace and aviation industries. The significant impacts of these industries for those in Brevard County and Central Florida cannot be overstated. The nation's economic and technological interests are enhanced daily by those who live and work in this area. As this region is forecast to grow significantly, this critical regional corridor will help to accommodate ever larger volumes of travelers, commuters, and residents.

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Clearing and grubbing and ROW acquisition.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will facilitate the future widening project. This regional roadway improvement will provide improved multi-modal accessibility to the residents, businesses, and visitors of Brevard County. This project will facilitate the Ellis Road Widening, which has been a top priority for the region for decades and in fact is the #1 Space Coast TPO, #1 Brevard County Transportation, and #1 Central Florida MPO Alliance Project. The overwhelming support for this project can be found within the 45 support letters the county and Space Coast TPO collected for a recent Federal Infra Grant Application.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project is part of the Ellis Road widening, which will provide improved access to the international airport, workforce development, and high-tech employment center. Ellis Road provides direct access from the Interstate for over 20,000 high tech, medical, and manufacturing jobs including but not limited to the Melbourne International Airport and surrounding aerospace and defense contractors. Melbourne International Airport also sees an estimated annual 500,000 (and growing) annual tourists.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will facilitate the Ellis Road widening which will address significant congestion along the corridor and lack of pedestrian and bicycle facilities. Ellis Road is identified as a corridor that provides access to critical regional assets. The transportation condition benefits will be measured by the reduced duration of congestion, improved travel time for emergency response, and walking / biking on the corridor. It also improves storm-water management and flooding, directly benefiting the Indian River Lagoon.
