4. Project/Program Description

The YMCA Family Center in Marion County (Frank DeLuca YMCA) has been serving the Ocala and Marion County area since 1996. A central community hub for youth, adults, and families, the Y Family Center provides programs and services for more than 10,000 people annually. Requested funds will help the Y optimize its current facilities to expand services for youth and families through the renovation of its decommissioned youth aquatic facilities to expand drowning prevention education and activities as well as provide access to people living with diverse abilities and activity and participation limitations and with the addition of a dedicated multi-purpose space for youth and teens for education, leadership, and enrichment programming.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Funding will support the critical infrastructure optimization needs at the YMCA Family Center in Marion County and expand the Y's capacity for critical programs and services that benefit and support the community. Through the optimization of current aquatics assets with the and the addition of new multi-purpose space, the YMCA Family Center will be best positioned and resourced to provide fully accessible environments for people of all abilities and ages; safe, positive environments for more youth and teens to build character and values through out of school time programs, leadership initiatives and sports programs; and flexible gathering spaces for community connection.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The renovation of the current youth aquatics facility with the addition of an Outdoor Splash Pad will provide inclusive aquatic enrichment space for people of varying abilities. The pool lift will be replaced, providing access for swimming lessons and recreational aquatics for all abilities allowing for greater reach for drowning prevention programming. The new multi-purpose youth center will host a variety of youth programs including summer day camp, out of school time programs, and teen leadership initiatives to positively impact our next generation of leaders and positively impact the community. Low income and under-served residents are able to take advantage of free programming offered at this YMCA Family Center.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The YMCA Family Center in Marion County provides critical programs for youth and families when school is not in session including summer day camp, afterschool programs, and teen leadership and enrichment programs. Additionally, the Y provides a variety of youth sports and e-sports programs. New multi-purpose youth space will expand the reach of the YMCA's current community engagement events and activities which include, Family Fun Nights, Healthy Kids Day, Back to School Backpack event, and other free community engagement events and programming. Swim lessons and Drowning Prevention programming are always a top priority for the YMCA as well.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Of the 10,000 people currently served annually, more than 50% of them are under the age of 18. We anticipate the ability to expand impact and reach in the target population by 25% annually increasing the total served to 12,500, with 6,250 under the age of 18. The Y Family Center is a lifeline in an area that has an under-served population with a high social vulnerability index. Low income and under-served residents are able to take advantage of free programming offered at this Family Center. The YMCA has need based financial assistance available for both membership and programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Community profile demographics demonstrate that there are over 95,000 people living within a 12-minute drive time of the Y Family Center and of those over 20,000 are youth. The Y expects to increase capacity and grow the numbers served in the target population (youth and families) on an annual basis by 25%. We anticipate growth in our membership base in addition to growth in the number of people benefiting from free YMCA programs and activities. The methodology used to track this growth and outcomes will be through tracked visits to the YMCA Family Centers and through program registration.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables or performance measures will result in either the inability to draw down all of the appropriated funds or the repayment of funds back to the agency.
