Palm Beach County is the recipient of CARES US Treasury funds in the amount of \$261 million. Funding was spent entirely on emergency assistance, mortgage assistance, business grants, COVID-19 sheltering, testing and isolation, as well as on emergency personnel. Palm Beach County also received approximately \$290 million in American Rescue Plan Funding for pandemic-related service and infrastructure projects.

#### 14. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Community Services is a steward of Palm Beach County's Nutrition Program for seniors and veterans. The goal to be achieved will be to provide many more individuals nutritious foods, nutrition education and nutrition counseling. This will improve their health, physically and mentally improving their quality of life. Providing increased nutrition services allows individuals more financial freedom to spend fixed income on housing, medication and other costs of living.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Grocery boxes will be designed to supplement necessary nutrients needed but typically lacking in senior diets. Boxes will be provided to older adults and veterans struggling to make ends meet. Many are homebound and will need home delivery. Early Bird Meal component at PBC senior centers will provide additional healthy congregate meals and entice seniors and veterans to socialize and volunteer.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Nutritious food to be provided along with nutrition education and counseling by a registered dietitian. Hand-outs & cooking classes to be included in direct services array. Use of CNAs to assist homebound seniors with warming and preparing meals providing companionship.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is veterans, the elderly, people with poor mental health, people with poor physical health, those who are economically disadvantaged, and the developmentally and physically disabled.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Each senior or veteran partaking in program will complete a Nutrition Assessment form. Individual declaration of portions of nutritious meal components at at start of program and then annually will occur. Mental health questions as suggested by the Florida Department of Elder Affairs will be asked as well and documented. We expect to see an improved physical and mental well being of participants which will be determined by pre and post participation surveys.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Corrective action plan, return of funding to the state if deliverables still fail to be met.
