4. Project/Program Description

Indiantown Road is one of the busiest roadways in Palm Beach County. The road is regularly congested and saturated with traffic. The Town recently contributed funds to a separate Florida Department of Transportation project in order to improve the traffic conditions. This project would act as a future improvement and next phase to extend the proposed lanes. This project would install a westbound auxiliary lane from Central Boulevard to the intersection at Jupiter West Plaza and an eastbound auxiliary lane from Central Boulevard to The Tompo Plaza. These improvements will allow traffic to more easily clear Jupiter's entrance limits which lead to I-95 and the Turnpike. Due to geographic restrictions, there are limited ways to access lower Martin County so that contributes to the need for easy traffic flow in and out of Jupiter.

Improve traffic conditions on one of the busiest roads in Palm Beach County. Assist motorists entering a exiting Jupiter at the point of entry from I-95 and the Turnpike. Traffic studies will be performed to show the improvement of traffic flow after the project is completed.

If the contractor for the construction were unable to fulfill their contractual duties then liquidated damages should be charged to the contractor against the balance of the contract. Should deliverables not be met, an appropriate penalty would be loss of grant funding.
