# c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

To date, the Jimmy Ryce Center has donated nearly 700 bloodhounds to law enforcement agencies. Our mission is to make the Ryce's goal a reality. Our efforts will help law enforcement search to find missing children, as well as endangered adults.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Statewide benefit working in partnership with state's law enforcement agencies. The bloodhounds will be utilized to assist law enforcement agencies to find missing children and endangered adults. The FBI and National Center for Missing and Exploited Children are all proponents of bloodhounds and their abilities.

# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

#### be measured?

The bloodhounds will be utilized to assist law enforcement agencies to find missing children and endangered adults. Law enforcement has done extensive studies on the accuracy of a bloodhound when finding a missing person. The FBI and the Center for Missing and Exploited Children places a high value on their accuracy as well as numerous local and national law enforcement agencies. The National Center even named a training center after Jimmy Ryce https://ojjdp.ojp.gov/library/publications/jimmy-ryce-law-enforcement-training-center-program. Every September, Florida observes Missing Children's Day at the State Capital. This was started in Jimmy's memory. We can track number of missions bloodhounds respond to including outcomes.
