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### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Dagger Dive is a therapeutic diving event fostering rehabilitation for wounded, ill, and/or injured special operations veterans and their families. Activities include diving lessons, family-centric events, and marine education. Emphasis is on strengthening family bonds, aiding veterans' physical and mental recovery, and enhancing mutual experiences in marine environments. The program offers specific mental health benefits by reducing stress through therapeutic water activities, promoting family bonding, and boosting self-esteem. Documented success stories highlight transformative mental and physical health journeys, offering qualitative evidence of the program's lasting impact.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding will facilitate therapeutic diving sessions for injured veterans and their families. Beneficiaries receive diving instruction, participate in family-oriented marine activities, and gain educational insights on marine ecosystems. These services aim to promote rehabilitation, family unity, and environmental appreciation among participants. Diving bolsters respiratory, cardiovascular health, and muscle coordination. The therapeutic aspect reduces stress, evident by lowering cortisol. It offers improved mobility for those with limitations. Engaging as a family in diving strengthens bonds and promotes collective physical enrichment. Skills from "Dagger Dive" inspire continued physical activity post-event.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The "Dagger Dive" program boosts local tourism by attracting participants and their families, increasing spending in accommodations, dining, and local attractions. Moreover, participants may pursue diving certifications or equipment, bolstering the dive industry. By promoting marine conservation, it ensures sustained tourism appeal, fostering a cyclic economic uplift for the community. The "Dagger Dive" program also necessitates local hires for event management, diving instructors, equipment handlers, and logistics. Local eateries, accommodations, and transport services experience heightened demand, leading to temporary job openings. Additionally, the event's spotlight on the region might attract future tourists, fostering sustained local employment opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Task Force Dagger provides services to all current or former Special Operations Service Members and their families, regardless of whether they served in the special ops components of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, etc. Dagger Dive participants are specifically vetted by both Task Force Dagger and the US Special Operations Command's Warrior Care Program to ensure they and their families would benefit from the specific physical and mental health therapies provided at Dagger Dive. The event has roughly 50-60 service members and their families participating, along with over 100 volunteers and staff - many of whom are veterans or family members of veterans themselves.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The three primary benefits expected are to improve veteran/family physical health, mental health, and improve awareness and education of Florida marine environment and local culture. In other to measure the effectiveness of the program, we conduct pre and post-event health assessments, distribute feedback surveys, and perform periodic follow-ups. Participants will log post-event activities, aiding in comparative analysis with non-participants. We'll monitor family activity metrics, seek professional evaluations, and document transformative success stories, providing a holistic insight into the program's impact. Success stories will spotlight transformative cultural experiences gained and lasting physical and mental health impacts.
