a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Our goal is to bridge the gap between minority communities and the healthcare system by addressing distrust around organ donation, and secondly, to establish a school-based curriculum fostering awareness and education on organ donation, donor statistics, and prevention of organ damage. Overall, the project aims to promote informed citizenship, increase organ donation participation, and reduce disparities among minority communities.

Standard Contract Penalties

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Our outreach initiatives focus on educating students and adults about organ donation and organ damage prevention. Using a dual approach, we integrate organ donation education into key school courses and bridge the gap between minority communities and healthcare. This dedicated effort combats distrust, promoting understanding of organ donation as well as organ damage prevention.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will directly support community events, educational programs, and initiatives in minority communities to dispel distrust around organ donation. It will also enable the development of a school-based curriculum, offering direct education on organ donation, donor statistics, and prevention of organ damage.

Under-represented communities and Florida public school students, grades sixth through ninth.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project aims to elevate organ donation awareness, fostering heightened participation, reduced skepticism, and effective organ damage prevention. Our minority outreach success will be gauged by evaluating event participation, the percentage surge in organ donor registrations within targeted minority communities and assessing public opinion on organ donation. Additionally, student comprehension and behavioral shifts will be meticulously measured through preand post-curriculum evaluations, ensuring a substantive impact on organ donation education and prevention of organ damage.
