14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Commercial vessel outfitting along the bulkhead continues to be difficult with unlimited rough seas which damage newly manufactured seagoing vessels and results in intolerable working conditions for shipfitters, welders, carpenters, plumbers, electricians and finish specialists who are unable to work in rough seas. The Complex Wavebreak will enable skilled workers to engage and complete vessel outfitting tasks regardless of rough seas or westerly winds.

Additionally, the Industrial Wavebreak will attract marine life by creating wildlife habitat creation including finfish, shellfish, saltwater species and coastal seabirds. While performing vessel and bulkhead protections measures, the Complex Wavebreak will enable snorkeling, fishing, birdwatching and recreational activities on all sides of the Wavebreak while industrial outfitting is taking place nearby at the bulkhead.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The jetty will provide protection from harsh winds and waves for the employees building the ships and as well as the ships moored to the seawall.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A jetty by the seawall that Gulf County does not currently have.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

It will help the employees who are building the ships; there are between 150 to 200 people employed at the business. It can also protect any boater trying to enter the marina from harsh winds and waves. Approximately 14,192 residents of Gulf County as well as visitors that travel to Gulf County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Gulf County is home to a business that builds ships. These ships are housed against a seawall near the marina. Harsh winds and waves push the ships into the seawall. A jetty will provide a breakwater to protect the ships and employees who are building the ships from harsh winds and waves. Any protection afforded to the ships and employees building the ships will improve safety for the employees and the quality of the ships being built.
