a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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A relocated water system to be more inland will protect it from natural disasters, such as hurricanes and storm surges. Moving away from the coastline will also protect it from saltwater intrusion.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The water system will provide a safe and reliable drinking water source for the County's residents and visitors that will be more resilient during disasters.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

An inland water system will provide the citizens with a reliable and safe water source, even during and after disasters.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Approximately 14,192 residents of Gulf County as well as visitors that travel to Gulf County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Storm vulverability analyses were conducted after the devastating impacts of Hurricane Michael left significant portions of the county's residents without a reliable source of water. The analyses call for the securing of the county's drinking water source, and the Northwest Florida Water Management District conducted inland well performance studies and paid for the construction of a production well to help identify and secure a more reliable source than that which was destroyed at the coast. A relocated water system to be more inland will protect it from natural disasters, such as hurricanes and storm surges. Moving away from the coastline will also protect it from saltwater intrusion. An inland water system will make it more resilient to hurricanes and storm surges. Safe and reliable water is a must for any community, especially during disasters.
