A Career Mentoring program that focuses on career planning, college prep, technical education, trades careers, job skills, financial literacy, self-esteem building, and healthy social/emotional habits for stronger mental health. Expansion to counties in Panhandle, Central Florida, and Florida Keys pairing career mentors and college students with foster girls.

Training workshops will be offered to support prevention and academic readiness, jobs kills, technical education, skilled trades careers, and financial literacy including stock trading careers

Education and prevention treatment services diversion, safe and nurturing environment for mentoring, training, leadership development, job readiness skills, college and career preparation, and life skills for managing in the real world independently.
