4. Project/Program Description

NAMI Florida is the state organization of the National Alliance on Mental Illness, the largest grassroots mental health organization in the nation. NAMI Florida's vision is that those who struggle with a mental health condition can recover and lead productive and meaningful lives within their community of choice. Expanding NAMI Family Support Groups, strengthening our state's and our affiliates' infrastructure and expanding NAMI Florida's reach would go a long way towards making that vision a reality. NAMI Family Support Groups will help participants find hope and support by connecting participants with others who face similar challenges. The participants will become a part of a community that understands, and they will learn from the knowledge and experience of other participants, and gain support in a confidential setting. Families, when supported effectively, will provide the first line of intervention and bridge the gap while the individual waits for care.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Our goal is to engage family members in family support. It is estimated there is an eight to ten year wait between symptom onset and when a person receives treatment. The NAMI Support Groups are led by trained family peers who increase family resilience, give family members a safe place to receive support, while offering hope and belonging. The NAMI Family Support Groups help family members identify concerning behavior, empower family members to de-escalate/reduce Baker Acts, and provide support for families in the best way to support their loved ones. The NAMI Family Support Groups will also share resources and help families navigate the behavioral health landscape. In 2021 it was estimated that 20% of high school students seriously considered ending their life. When their family members learn the warning signs, learn how to talk to their children, and learn how to work with school staff, lives are saved. The more support family members the less situtions that will escalate to crisis

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Access to Family Support Groups is increased and offered by our 24 affiliates. These funds would strengthen our statewide operational infrastructure allowing for continued growth, expansion, and accessibility to meet the increased need for family education and Family Support Services. Florida is facing a Behavioral Health Workforce shortage. Family support does not replace clinical care, but it can be a life changing enhancement to clinical care. Individuals' outcomes are improved when their families receive support, and the individual is more likely to be more compliant when they have a support system supporting them.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

NAMI Family Support Groups allow individuals to see family members who are successfully managing their loved ones' condition. Individuals gain insight from trained family peers who guide them to better understand the catastrophic stressors that untreated symptoms present. Through role-modeling of recovery concepts, the individuals gain useful strategies that support their loved one while maintaining their own, and their family's well-being. NAMI Family Support Group certified facilitators guide individuals to resources on various topics including: estate planning, insurance, health care surrogacy and/or Power of Attorney, SSDI, SSI, Medicaid/Medicare, HIPAA Laws, FACT Teams, treatments, medication assistance programs, nutrition and weight management, complementary and/or Alternative Therapies (i.e. massage, yoga), crisis management, contacting Law Enforcement/Requesting CIT Officers, Job Opportunities, and training resources.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is any individual who needs support and seeks better coping skills to empower a loved one who may be experiencing symptoms of a mental health condition. This target population includes family members of veterans, first responders, teachers, students, those living in rural and underserved communities, the elderly, youth, young adults, and those in low-income areas. Outreach to Medical Professionals, hospitals, and other clinical treatment sites will be critical because of the number of individuals and families they serve. Based on how pervasive mental health symptoms are and the population of the state of Florida, we expect to engage with over 100,000 families throughout the state.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

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NAMI Florida expects to engage 100,000 families and 1,000 volunteers through social media, outreach events, hospitals, provider outreach, community events, our 24 affiliates and through presentations with businesses, school staff, first responders, and faith leaders. These family members will bridge the gap and create pathways for care for their loved one. This project will support the family and help build family resiliency. The increased operational infrastructure will produce an outcome where citizens throughout Florida are well equipped to meet the needs of their loved ones when they experience behavioral health symptoms. The individuals will be connected to the natural support in their community and will experience the strength found in sharing their experiences. This appropriation project will increase the reach of our affiliates and help create sustainability. The affiliates without staff are run completely by volunteers, which impacts the organization's effectiveness.
