More than half of the funds were provided directly to students.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

These funds will be used to remodel existing space on TCC main campus to create a living laboratory for students in the A.S. degree programs in Energy Management and Control Systems. We will maximize our partnerships with industry leaders to ensure students have the necessary hands-on experience necessary to to succeed in building automation and energy management jobs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will be used to finalize the planning and design of the building #17 remodel and to complete the construction project. Upon completion of the remodel, students will be able to work in a real-world environment learning energy management, building automation, systems control and more on multiple vendor products and working with TCC industry partners. This remodel will create a living laboratory that will provide advanced instruction and graduates who will be able to pick from among many job offers.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

These programs will provide employment opportunities for students in high-wage and high-demand fields. It will provide immediate economic impact to our students as well as meet regional hiring demands in these fields.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are students and future students in the energy management AS degree program at TCC. This 2-year program provides a great opportunity to obtain valuable skills and credentials for high-demand, high-wage jobs. This will provide economic mobility and financial stability for participants.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
