Renovation/Remodeling/expansion of a facility allowing for high-demand workforce programs such as welding, electrician, and industrial maintenance and repair. c. Citizens in North Florida College's six-county service district - Jefferson, Taylor, Madison, Lafayette, Hamilton, and Suwannee counties - are the target population. This Legislative Appropriation will allow North Florida College to significantly expand high-demand workforce program offerings for many years into the future. The building will be designed for programmatic flexibility in mind. This will allow the College to use the lab spaces for multiple workforce education programs.
