1. Project Title	A Lifeline for IRL Dolphins: First Responder Infrastructure and Workforce Enhancement

### 4. Project/Program Description

Bottlenose dolphins in the Indian River Lagoon (IRL) are facing unprecedented threats, and urgent action is needed to safeguard these iconic creatures and the fragile ecosystem they depend on. More than 90% of northern IRL dolphins are currently underweight or emaciated, including 97% of female dolphins with dependent calves (Durden et al. 2023). Dolphin interactions with fishermen and entanglement in fishing line are also increasing, stressing overburdened marine mammal response teams. To address this unprecedented situation, Hubbs-SeaWorld Research Institute (HSWRI) is requesting support to enhance marine mammal first responder capacity, accelerate water quality and habitat restoration, and conduct targeted public outreach to increase support for restoration initiatives. A related Community Project Funding request supported by Congressman Posey was included in the FY24 U.S. House Appropriations Bill, which is pending review by the House of Representatives.

HSWRI will leverage 60 years of experience to provide high-level care for injured and entangled dolphins and to lead public outreach underscoring the urgent need for restoration of IRL habitats. HSWRI will also work with Florida-based commercial aquaculture producers Sea & Shoreline and SEAMRI LLC to build high-capacity seagrass and shellfish nurseries to provide essential seed stock for restoration of habitats critical to dolphins, manatees, and regional fisheries.

### 14. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Goal 1: Strengthen marine mammal response and assessment, including for mass strandings, Unusual Mortality Events, and entanglements in an area with elevated rates of human interaction. Goal 2: Complete required repairs to the Institute's boat ramp, dock, and seawall, and install electrical and potable water service to allow partner-led production and out planting of the nursery-grown seagrass plugs and shellfish seed stock needed for IRL habitat restoration. Goal 3: Conduct targeted outreach emphasizing the urgent need for restoration of IRL habitats and the connection between healthy dolphin populations and a vibrant fishing community.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Operational support will increase marine mammal first-responder workforce capacity and improve outcomes for entangled and stranded dolphins. Understanding dolphin health trends and threats will also aid Florida Fish and Wildlife agency stock management and other obligations under the Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA). HSWRI will also work with Florida-based commercial aquaculture producers Sea & Shoreline and

Protection Act (MMPA). HSWRI will also work with Florida-based commercial aquaculture producers Sea & Shoreline and SEAMRI LLC to build high-capacity seagrass and shellfish nurseries to provide essential seed stock for restoration of habitats critical to dolphins, manatees, and regional fisheries.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services to citizens include outreach emphasizing the urgent need for restoration of IRL habitats and the connection between healthy marine mammal populations and a vibrant sportfishing community. We will engage with the sportfishing community through workshops, presentations, and informational placards at prominent fishing locales to increase support for marine conservation efforts, including responsible disposal of entangling fishing line. We will also work directly with Florida-based commercial aquaculture producers Sea & Shoreline and SEAMRI to build and operate high-capacity seagrass and shellfish nurseries to support ongoing IRL restoration efforts.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The IRL is a regional economic driver, generating an inflation adjusted \$3.6 billion in lagoon related recreation and commercial fishing. Addressing loss of water quality, degrading habitats, and reoccurring marine mammal mortality events will help to improve and maintain economic conditions on which most residents, businesses, and visitors directly and indirectly depend.

Enhanced first responder capacity and public outreach to decrease stranding response time, reduce dolphin entanglement in fishing gear, and improve dolphin health assessment with a focus on tracking emerging threats and ecosystem recovery. Accelerated development of high-capacity seagrass and shellfish nurseries to meet surface water quality, habitat restoration, and protected marine mammal management action items identified in IRLNEP 2019 Comprehensive Conservation Management Plan (pages 55, 59, and 91). Progress towards outcomes will be measured with quarterly reporting of aquaculture production by project partners, HSWRI effort tracking, and annual dolphin stranding and entanglement reporting to NOAA Fisheries.
