14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Simulation training allows first responders to engage in ongoing education, skills development, and to improve the readiness and preparedness of first responders to effectively handle real-life emergencies. By practicing in simulated scenarios, responders become better equipped to respond to a wide range of incidents, from fires, natural disasters, medical emergencies and mass casualty events. Ultimately, the goal is to enhance the safety and well-being of the communities served.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The key is to ensure that first responders receive comprehensive, high-quality training to enhance their preparedness, skills, and ability to respond effectively to emergencies. The creation of realistic, hands-on simulation scenarios that replicate various emergency situations to assess the performance of responders during training exercises.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

While the primary focus of fire/rescue and EMS simulation training is to enhance the capabilities of first responders, these indirect benefits ultimately lead to improved safety and well-being for the citizens they serve. Better-trained first responders can lead to reduced liability potentially resulting in cost savings that can be reinvested in other community services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The over 600 Firefighter/Paramedics, driver engineers and specialized staff of the Broward Sheriff's Office who provide public safety services to multiple municipalities, the airport and seaport and regional services county wide.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

By improving the training and preparedness of fire and EMS personnel, citizens can benefit from more efficient and effective emergency response in their communities. This can lead to quicker response times, better medical care, and more successful fire suppression efforts. Baseline data comparison will be utilized to compare response times to critical medical and fire emergencies before and after the implementation of enhanced simulation training. Also, the historical response time data to critical medical emergencies (e.g., cardiac arrests, strokes, severe trauma) in the target service areas will be used to measure and compare the response times to actual emergencies, and track whether the improvements observed in simulation training translate to improved outcomes in real-world scenarios.
