4. Project/Program Description

The ex-USS Orleck is a 78 year old destroyer moored in Jacksonville, FL and is the ONLY warship museum in Florida. Many areas throughout the ship require refurbishment, air conditioning, new electrical wiring at a minimum before these spaces can be safely opened to the public. Examples include gun mount and torpedo handling rooms, aft engine room, Combat Information Center, and providing onboard restrooms for overnight guests. In addition, the pier where the ship is located requires significant repairs to make the pier safe for general visiting.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Many areas throughout the ship require refurbishment, air conditioning, new electrical wiring at a minimum before these spaces can be safely opened to the public. Examples include torpedo handling room, Combat Information Center, and providing onboard restrooms for overnight guests. In addition, the pier where the ship is located requires significant repairs to make the pier safe for general visiting.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Increased usage of the only Naval Museum in the State of Florida for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math + History (STEAM+H) offerings to schools and veterans groups as well as returning more parts of the ship to tour routes for the general public.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Classes in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math + History (STEAM+H), better access to historic locations on the ship such as the Combat Information Center, and also the ability to house overnight groups such as Scouts and veterans groups. In addition to serving all of Florida, residents of the State will not have to travel to Charleston, SC nor Mobile, AL for a warship experience.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

General visiting from all 67 Florida counties and visitors from out of state, Veterans and their families, school age children and school tours, Title 10 disadvantaged children (some of whom have never been on the St Johns River), and persons with disabilities. In other words, all organized groups, events of honor, and the general public will always be welcome.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Only location in Florida to tour and learn about how sailors worked and lived from the end of WWII through Desert Storm. ex-USS Orleck's history includes 14 Battle Stars as the most decorated warship in Vietnam. The Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math + History (STEAM+H) will be demonstrating many practical applications of all elements associated with Naval ships. This includes semiphore, Ham radio operations, radar, etc. Methodology employed will include the number of persons attending general STEAM+H classes, number of school tours for all ages, and surveys with direct feedback.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Jacksonville Historic Naval Ship Assn (JHNSA) will abide by the recommended penalties, typically a % of funding lost for not completing the all of the project that represents that portion of funding.
