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Martin County (MC) received \$28,093,258 from the CARES Act in 2020 which was allocated to a variety of COVID-19 relief initiatives for local small businesses, non-profits, and mental health to offset the impacts of the pandemic such as capital and operational enhancements to mitigate the spread of the virus. MC received \$31,272,363 from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) which is currently being utilized to provide grants to community partners and fund capital infrastructure for clean water.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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A safer and quicker level of emergency service to the residents and visitors of Martin County, build staff capacity with rigorous training, and allow staff to complete required training on-site without depleting resources to send them to train in other counties. Increased county revenue by 1) offering Training Tower facility rental/usage by outside agencies and 2) cost and resource savings gained by not sending staff outside of Martin County for required training.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

County staff will administer the Contract for design and construction of the project. County staff will also perform outreach of the project benefits and interim impacts during construction.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A well trained emergency response staff able to increase response times and improved level of response to public emergencies by fire rescue staff.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The entire County population will see increased response times and improved level of response to public emergencies by fire rescue staff.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increase response times and improved level of response to public emergencies by fire rescue staff. Increased county revenue by 1) offering Training Tower facility rental/usage by outside agencies and 2) cost and resource savings gained by not sending staff outside of Martin County for required training. Increase fire rescue staff capacity by providing an inhouse training tower. Properly trained staff will reduce risk of injury while performing job functions. Monitor fire rescue response times, staff turnover rates, job satisfaction ratings, hours and level of staff training, staff promotions and Monitor fire rescue staff training hours. Monitor on the job injury rates and days missed due to injury.
