#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Pathways to Home, a program of RISE Community Solutions, will locate and secure permanent housing for 25 child welfare-involved families who are experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity, with the intent to prevent children from entering/re-entering the child welfare system through response to the family's housing needs. By preventing entry into formal out-of-home care, the system more effectively utilizes available taxpayer resources.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

In addition to needs-based financial assistance, families will participate in intensive housing case management to address goals for self-sufficiency.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services to be provided are housing location services; payment of moving costs, rent assistance, utility assistance, and education costs; budgeting; case management; safety planning; financial literacy education; and referrals to supportive services such as employment, mental health, behavioral health, and substance abuse services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted populations are child-welfare involved families, or families with children who are at risk of entering the child welfare system as a response to the family's housing insecurity or an experience of homelessness. The funds will secure housing for 25 families, or more than 100 individuals in Orange, Osceola, and Seminole counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Each family will be expected to show an increase of at least one point in the physical health, mental health, economic, education, and substance abuse domains as measured by the Arizona Self-Sufficiency Matrix assessment tool between the time of intake and the time of exit from the program. Additionally, 85% of participating families will not experience homelessness within six months of exiting the program.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
