### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To restore a1939 WPA Historic National Registered Structure for public use.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

In 2021, the city had to close the Bunnell City Hall for use due to deteriorating conditions of the building and safety concerns for occupants as validated by a building inspector. In 2022, remediation of the building was completed at costs exceeding \$100,000. Additional funding is needed to reconstruct and make necessary changes to the building to prevent it from experiencing additional environmental issues and to restore the facility to a safe, functional building.



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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Historic City Hall restoration will benefit culture and education, but it also will help to boost the economy. Tourism dollars could aid the community by keeping this structure alive, well, and as close to the way it was in the original appearance. Preserving and restoring old structures is good for business. It benefits travel and tourism, helps create jobs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Benefits residents of Flagler County, population 140,000.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The City Hall restoration will benefit culture and education, but it also helps to boost the economy.
