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We received \$12,712,034 in total HEERF funding. 50% (\$6,356,017) is allocated for distribution directly to students as emergency financial aid grants - \$2,708,794 has been distributed to students. Remaining 50% for institutional use. \$1,354,397 for refunds to students for room & board fees in 2020. \$1,354,397 to cover COVID related operating expenses & operational losses due to COVID19. Remaining \$3,647,223 was used for COVID19 related expenses and building a more resilient campus.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Strategic hiring of key faculty trained in the classical model of education to work directly with students in their first-year seminar courses. K12 Classical teachers receive professional development through Summer Trainings, Colloquia & Saturday Seminars. K12 classical summer camps for scholars and public lectures.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Full-time faculty teaching First Year Seminar course students. The development of a retention model based on the classical model of education. Workshops, conferences, public lectures, and guest scholars. Additionally the Institute will provide academic fellowship & mentoring opportunities to students engaged in scholarly studies and provide training to K-12 classical teachers statewide.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

College Students, Faculty, and K-12 Classical School Teachers. Approximately 2,000 individuals annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Enrich Cultural Experience - Through the FYS course, students learn about the value and responsibilities of citizenship in a diverse democracy. Consistent with the classical model of education, students will read about political philosophy and the history of science, or explore the cultural meanings of business and entertainment. Flagler students are living in the Oldest City in the United States. Measurement - Course evaluations will help us evaluate the impact on our students' cultural experience. Additionally, we will evaluate the level of our student's community engagement. Improve Quality of Education - First year students will benefit from having Full-time faculty trained in the Classical model of education teaching their first year seminar courses.
