Funds were used for rent and mortgage payments for Pace Centers; the employee portion of benefits; and temporary salary increases for staff retention. Employee Retention Tax Credit: \$9,810,000 received in May 2023. Funds were used for mortgage payments, new computers for staff and girls and Center maintenance and upgrades.

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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The new building will be used for the Pace Center in Volusia County that operates 250 days per year and serves girls at risk of juvenile justice system involvement. Currently Pace Volusia operates out of a 100-year-old historic building that is dilapidated and is insufficient space to serve at full capacity. The building was also damaged by Hurricane Ian. The new facility will include a safe location for classrooms, counseling, offices and other safety features, and will allow us to serve more girls in the County. The goal of the Pace program is for all girls to lead productive, engaged and fulfilling lives.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The building will be used to serve approximately 100 girls annually who are at risk of juvenile justice system involvement. Girls receive wrap around social services such as therapy, counseling and life skills. Girls in the Pace Center also receive their full academic school day. Services are provided in a trauma-informed, gender-responsive and strength-based environment. The facility will also include a culinary arts program.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The building will house a Pace Center, providing comprehensive wrap around social services and the full academic school day to approximately 100 girls at risk of delinquency. Case management for the girl's family is also provided to ensure a stable home environment. The goal of the Pace program is to prevent justice system involvement, and for girls to lead productive, engaged and fulfilling lives.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Pace will serve approximately 100 middle and high school age girls at risk for juvenile justice system involvement and dropping out of school. The girls' families benefit from Pace both indirectly and through family engagement, home visits and counseling. The general public also benefits through increased public safety.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Funding will provide a safe space for Pace girls to receive comprehensive wrap around social services and their full academic school day. Short term outcomes for girls include 1) maintaining attendance and advancing grade levels 2) demonstrated increase in self-efficacy and pro-social coping skills; and 3) reduction in risky behaviors. Long term outcomes include 1) high school graduation and enrollment in post-secondary education or the workforce; 2) obtaining employment; 3) no involvement in the criminal justice system; and 4) decreased economic dependency. Pace Center utilizes a combination of output data and outcome data to measure outcomes.
