### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Protect the general public from harm - Intelligence gathered will combat violent street gangs, drug trafficking organizations, security threat groups, continuing criminal enterprises, and human trafficking networks. As part of the planned implementation, the technology will directly address and reduce criminal activity throughout Florida, keeping our communities safer.

Improve mental health - Intelligence gathered will help identify in real time incarcerated individuals who may be experiencing mental health episodes to include suicide prevention. As part of the planned implementation, the technology will notify identified staff to assist those in need.

Reduce substance abuse - Intelligence will assist in the interdiction of contraband such as controlled substances being smuggled into correctional facilities. As part of the planned implementation, the technology will notify identified staff to reduce the introduction of narcotics in correctional institutions.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The contracted service is integrated with correctional facilities' authorized communications systems to increase safety in the prison system.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The public safety technology will combat the introduction of contraband into correctional facilities, identify and suppress violent street gangs, drug trafficking organizations, security threat groups, continuing criminal enterprises, and human trafficking networks. It will also help identify incarcerated individuals who may be experiencing mental health episodes to include suicide prevention.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Currently or formerly incarcerated person; drug offenders (in criminal justice); victims of crime; persons with poor mental health; and the public at large will benefit from the usage of this important public safety technology.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased safety and security within correctional institutions that will meaningfully lower crime rates, promote recidivism reduction, and address inmate mental health. FDC will be at the forefront of aggregating authorized communications for intelligence and information to help keep communities across Florida safer.

The Department will receive regularly scheduled summary reports detailing the services findings, tracking incidents discovered and calculating resource savings generated.
