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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The project will create career pathways for citizens entering the community after incarceration; to create positive impact on the local economy and increase safety through, training, job placement, and soft skills development for returning citizens as well as adults from the general population. This aviation based program involves participants aged 18-50 providing comprehensive industry-related STEM and technical skills

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Our comprehensive aviation program will provide opportunities for individuals with an immersive 10-15 week training experience focused on aviation and mechanics. The activities provided are on-the-job training, educational courses with industry certifications, job placement, case management and scholarships to ensure the participants are adequately prepared to work.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Participants will benefit from a structured curriculum encompassing flight and maintenance training, mentorship by industry professionals, assistance securing aviation jobs, scholarships for pilot licenses, and case management to address personal challenges and ensure program success. These direct services are designed to ensure the success for each participant.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served by this project are jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, physically disabled, high school students, currently or formerly incarcerated persons. This project is expected to serve 51-100 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit is to improve mental health, the aviation program will help participants reduce stress and anxiety levels. This can be measured by involving a systematic and data-driven approach via surveys, questionnaires, interviews, focus group sessions, etc. To improve quality of education is another expected benefit that would include various factors, including standardized test
