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To support critical needs for renewing campus infrastructure - Roof replacements & envelope repairs; HVAC renovations & replacements; Central utilities infrastructure updates; Fire safety system upgrades; Roadway, parking area & pedestrian pathway improvements; Enhancements to campus security and signage; ADA accessibility modifications in existing buildings; Replacement of outdated building equipment; Construction & renovation of campus lighting systems; and Renovations of interior finishes.

This project will support the college's goal of maintaining a safe and sanitary campus for all students, employees and visitors while maintaining building code and accessibility compliance. Improved energy efficiency across facilities and critical infrastructure will reduce waste and save energy costs over time.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improvements will lead to better indoor air quality across campus by eliminating leaks and enhancing humidity controls and air exchanges; create energy efficiencies and cost savings through building equipment replacement, including central utilities infrastructure; correct deficiencies related to life safety, health and sanitation; improve accessibility and security; reduce maintenance overhead.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Santa Fe College's student population, employees and visitors to college facilities.

This project supports the college's goal of maintaining a safe and sanitary campus by improving indoor air quality, maintaining critical life safety standards and building code compliance and increasing accessibility across the campus.
