Local history education through continually refreshed programming, plus the archiving and preservation of Jacksonville's past, while helping to advocate for preservation and adaptive re-use of a historic property through museum and archives visitation, public event programming, and space rentals.

The target population is the residents of Jacksonville, as well as the thousands of visitors and tourists drawn to the First Coast. School groups will be hosted for educational events at the center to educate the next generation on Jacksonville's rich history.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The completed renovations will provide a destination for visitors and a space for the establishment of a museum/archive and event venue focused in part on Jacksonville's history. Visitor data will be logged and tracked.
