#### 4. Project/Program Description

Florida Atlantic University will add a Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD) program and a College of Dentistry on the Boca Raton campus. The DMD program will produce general dentists who will provide comprehensive person-centered oral health care for patients of all ages and abilities by working in teams with other health care providers. The College of Dentistry will be housed in a new 94,000 square foot facility and will be the second public dental school in the state. The program will focus on recruiting students with a passion to work in underserved and rural areas. In addition to hiring faculty and professional staff, the start-up of the program will require state-of-the-art specialized equipment, operating capital outlay and other personnel services such as consultants. The FAU College of Dentistry aims to begin offering the Doctor of Dental Medicine degree program beginning in 2027.

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#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This request supports the continued creation and operations of the FAU College of Dentistry, as well as the infrastructure for the College including the hiring of a founding dean, associate dean for student affairs, assistant dean of curriculum, senior faculty, and administrative personnel. FAU will hire an assistant dean of admissions and staff to support student and faculty recruitment goals, work with a consulting firm to expedite accreditation, purchase learning tools and equipment and will create scholarships and incentives to encourage professional service in rural and underserved areas after graduation.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

In addition to standardized patient clinical program requirements, dental care clinic experiences will be operationalized throughout FAU's service area, similar to the clinical rotations provided by FAU's College of Medicine and College of Nursing. The College of Dentistry will partner with public and private partners in the FAU Health Network and is an essential component of FAU Health Network's mission to best serve the growing population of Florida. The clinical, educational and research opportunities afforded by offering a Doctor of Dental Medicine degree will further enhance Florida's life sciences sector, boosting all workforce and related economic impact.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

FAU Health Network aims to best serve the healthcare needs of the population of the region and of Florida through education, research integration, and inter-professional practice. The FAU College of Dentistry is a key pillar in this foundation of care delivery, providing a pipeline of highly trained dental professionals that are well equipped to serve the community and have a focus on serving rural and underserved areas.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Between 80-90% of the dental students that train in Florida remain in Florida, and this will have a tremendous impact on the number of dentists available to serve in the state. Focusing the curriculum on serving the underserved will benefit the 63 counties that have a shortage of dental providers and in FAU's direct service area of Palm Beach, Broward, Martin, St. Lucie, and Indian River counties.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The primary educational outcomes of the Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD) degree program include student enrollment and graduation numbers. Primary workforce outcomes are the number and percentage of students who successfully pass the National Board Dental Examination and enter the dental workforce in Florida, specifically in underserved and/or rural parts of the state. FAU's DMD will increase the number of dental graduates in Florida and will recruit students likely to stay in the region as they develop ties to the community, increasing the likelihood of retention. ROI includes increases in the number of dentists, as well as allied dental professionals, such as dental hygienists and assistants, that are added to Florida's workforce.

### f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If Florida Atlantic University does not execute the plan as proposed, the state of Florida may relinquish all funds associated with this request.
