14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This funding will prepare students and young adults with intellectual disabilities for transition to the workplace or post-secondary education. The funds will be used to educate employers on the benefits of employing people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, educate families on post-secondary options, and place individuals with disabilities in jobs that pay at or above minimum wage.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Best Buddies will provide services to place 50 adults in jobs, deliver 20 trainings on hiring people with disabilities to potential employers, and develop 28 new employer partners across the state. Expand into jobs market by engaging employer partners with a commitment to hire.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services provided will be person-centered, individualized support to prepare participants for employment, placement, job coaching after placement, and follow along services to ensure long-term success.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for the FY25 Best Buddies Job Project are individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities seeking employment. In FY25, Best Buddies anticipates serving 50 individuals with disabilities age 18 and up.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The FY25 Best Buddies Jobs Project will create more inclusive workplaces for employees with disabilities by engaging and educating new employer partners and placing adults with IDD in competitive, inclusive jobs. Best Buddies staff will utilize Set-Works, an internal case-management system, to track project activities and manage participant records. Project outcomes will be measured using Set-Works data reports, periodic progress reports, and the Best Buddies annual survey which is distributed to program participants, supervisors, and employer partners.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Financial consequences for each missed deliverable per quarter: \$250 per missed training; \$50 per missed job placement in Q1, \$250 per missed training; \$50 per missed job placement in Q2, \$250 per missed training; \$50 per missed job placement in Q3, and \$250 per missed training; \$50 per missed job placement in Q4.
