This project reduces potential exposure to wastewater from compromised and failing septic tank systems, will lead to removal of nutrient and bacterial sources of pollution from septic tank effluent, and reduces safety hazard to students and pedestrians in the area through roadway improvements. Benefits can be measured by number of septic tanks removed as well as number of accidents for the two different aspects of the project, respectively.
