14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

FFC is looking to continue on its goal of creating meaningful connections with foster youth in Central Florida through 1-on-1 mentoring, life skills coaching, educational support, and services that have proven to lead to positive outcomes for the community's most vulnerable youth. The goal of EMPOWER is to ensure that every youth can grow toward independence and success in their lives. Through FFCs EMPOWER program, 155 youth were paired with Advocates to receive weekly life skills training and mentoring in 2023 (YTD), leading to 99% of foster youth avoiding arrests (compared to the national average of 47%), 98% avoiding homelessness (compared to the national average of 70%), 90% achieving employment or post-secondary education (compared to the national average of 60%) and 91% reaching on track to graduate (compared to the national average of 50%). In 2024. FFC looks to increase its youth served to 175 foster youth in the region.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

FFC's EMPOWER program relies heavily upon the dedication of its experienced and knowledgeable Advocates. Through the sponsorship of these critical salaries (unrestricted funds), the EMPOWER program can continue to extend its outreach throughout Orange County, Osceola County, and Seminole County. FFC's EMPOWER program provides personalized support through advocacy, with Advocates meeting with youth weekly for one-on-one mentoring. During these meetings, Advocates provide the planning, support, and coaching necessary to ensure that each young adult in the program receives the care, services, and attention they need to carry out and achieve their specific goals.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

FFC's EMPOWER program will provide the support and invaluable resources necessary to transition foster youth (aged 14 to 24) into adulthood to become meaningful contributors to society. FFC's EMPOWER program serves foster youth with professional, trauma-informed, evidence-based care. FFC's EMPOWER program focuses on empowering youth in foster care between the ages of 14 and 24 to overcome barriers that may prevent them from graduating high school, securing employment, and finding stable housing. Additionally, FFC Advocates provide life skills training and mentoring to give at-risk youth a consistent and trusted voice as they navigate through early adulthood, avoiding substance abuse, behavioral issues, and life choices that may lead to incarceration.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Foundation for Foster Children's EMPOWER: Advocacy Initiative program provides personalized support and invaluable resources to the 2,784 foster youth living in Orange County, Osceola County, and Seminole County. FFC's EMPOWER program looks to serve 175 foster youth (aged 14 to 24) in Central Florida through this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

In 2023 (YTD), FFC served 607 foster youth (ages 0 to 24) through all FFC programs in Orange, Osceola, and Seminole counties. Last year, FFCs EMPOWER program provided 2,042 unique opportunities, including 325 transitioning to adulthood opportunities, 366 youth development opportunities, and 233 youth served through 14,758 advocacy hours in the region. In 2024, FFC's EMPOWER program looks to serve 175 foster youth.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

If the Foundation for Foster Children fails to meet the performance measures provided for in the contract, funding may be paused until corrective action is implemented to meet requirements.
