14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

At Forgotten Coast K9, we strive to reduce veteran and first responder suicides by utilizing task trained service dogs. This funding will be used to provide services, support, and training for our dogs and heroes. Once their online training is completed they come to Madison, FL where we house, feed, and equip them while providing an additional 80 hours of hands on training to supplement their previous 30 weeks of live online training.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

An 8 week or 30 week live online school where the handler learns care and training of the dog is accompanied by either a trained dog or a puppy (depending on the program chosen). We "finish" the team by introducing it to all the necessary equipment and then utilizing the equipment in real world environments designed to progress each handler/dog team to be comfortable in a variety of settings. This allows the team to encounter new situations with confidence.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

We train and provide service dogs and related equipment to veterans and first responders suffering from PTS and MST who have completed one of our Programs. We also have ongoing contact with our graduating teams which allows us to help them through any issues which may arise as they learn to live with their service dog.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Veterans and first responders suffering from PTS and/or MST. Additionally, we can provide dogs that respond to a variety of other disabilities to include seizure alert and diabetic detection. We expect to serve 12 veterans with this funding.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Lower stress levels, reduced symptoms of PTS/MST symptoms, reduction of alcohol and prescription drug abuse. These outcomes will be measured subjectively based on independent conversations with the individual. Reduction in depression symptoms objectively measured through effective use of the Beck Depression Inventory. The BDI is administered during the application process, at the end of the selected program, and at the one year mark of the individual graduating.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Monies associated with the purchase costs of each dog not delivered.
