To design and build a new St. Marks Fire Rescue Facility at on SR 363 Woodville Highway on Wakulla County (County) owned property as the current facility floods and is not safe for 1st responders to provide proficient emergency services to community. The new location will eliminate the risk of coastal flooding during disaster events as well as mitigate the impact of sea level rise and will provide optimum coverage and response times in the eastern portion of the County and increase the citizen cost saving through improved insurance ratings.
