4. Project/Program Description

Manatee River at the Jacksonville Zoo & Gardens is a \$70 million project with the primary objective is to enhance the Manatee Critical Care Center (MCCC) to meet the increased demand for acute care and rehabilitation for manatees, particularly in light of the ongoing Unusual Mortality Event along Florida's east coast. With the current Florida manatee population, the species transitioned from endangered to threatened under the federal Endangered Species Act in May 2017. The expansion of the MCCC encompasses a revamped zoo entrance and habitat, featuring four treatment pools and three convalescent areas within the Manatee River habitat, offering a total of 330,000 gallons of space. This upgraded facility aims to significantly bolster the zoo's rehabilitation efforts, enhancing its ability to promptly and effectively respond to the rescue and medical care of an increased number of distressed manatees, especially during the heightened winter rescues.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



The funds will play a crucial role in advancing the development of the Manatee River at the Jacksonville Zoo & Gardens. The primary objective is to enhance the Manatee Critical Care Center (MCCC) to meet the increased demand for acute care and rehabilitation for manatees, particularly in light of the ongoing Unusual Mortality Event along Florida's east coast. With the current Florida manatee population, manatees transitioned from endangered to threatened under the federal Endangered Species Act in May 2017. The expansion encompasses a revamped zoo entrance and habitat, featuring four treatment pools and three convalescent areas within the Manatee River habitat, offering a total of 330,000 gallons of space. This upgraded facility aims to triple thee zoo's rehabilitation efforts, enhancing its ability to promptly and effectively respond to the rescue and medical care of an increased number of distressed manatees.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A variety of activities and services will be implemented to enhance the Manatee Critical Care Center (MCCC) and promote conservation education. This involves the construction of a new zoo entrance, four treatment pools, and three habitats, effectively tripling the Zoo's rehabilitation capacity. Additionally, a tailored educational program for increasing awareness and encouraging public engagement.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Manatee River is designed to educate visitors about the importance of protecting and caring for Florida's manatees, Manatee River will feature informative displays, multimedia presentations, and interpretive signage. The overarching goal is to inspire a sense of responsibility among visitors towards manatee conservation, encouraging them to actively become advocates for manatee protection.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The manatee population in the state of Florida will be served by the Manatee Critical Care Center, as well as thousands of Jacksonville Zoo and Gardens visitors will experience the benefits of the newly constructed manatee river.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Manatee River will increase guests understanding and appreciation of local wildlife and ecosystems. JZG uses pre- and post-visit surveys to assess visitors' knowledge and attitudes toward local wildlife and ecosystems. Evaluate qualitative feedback and conduct interviews to understand the perceived cultural enrichment resulting from the experience. By educating students and general public, there will be a reduction in potential harm to the environment through increased awareness and responsible behavior. JZG expects to have an increase in tourism, specifically due to the Manatee River experience, which could be tracked by visitor demographics, surveys and attendance data.
