In addition, the station is in the middle of the median of a busy roadway (Inverrary Blvd) and its reconstruction and relocation would result in a safer and reliable operation meeting the needs of the community.

This project will improve Wastewater service to residents as well as provide an a a new and improved lift station to pump waste water collected from the residential homes within this basin.

The targeted population is the disadvantaged communities within central portion of the Clty. approximately 15,000 residents.

The improvement of the lift station will reduce cost, reduce maintenance repairs, reduce sewer overflows into streets, and to improve operational effectiveness within the Lift station.
