Funds were used to defray City costs for PPE, public safety payrool, telework related costs, food distributions, etc. \$13,042,828 from ARPA, used for utility billing assistance, restoring capital cuts, stormwater master plan, and sewer lining.

Relocation of the water and sewer lines will assist the City with work necessitated by FDOT's replacement project and ensure FDOT can begin replacement work as scheduled.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will ensure the state's replacement of the bridge is on schedule- guarding against delays which may drive up costs and ensuring the safety of those crossing the bridge.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The City has around 93,000 residents. Residents will benefit from their state tax dollars assisting with work necessitated by a state project. The project staying on schedule will benefit an even higher number of people. The 65th Avenue bridge connects to W Sunrise Blvd, which is a main thoroughfare in Broward County and feeds into the Florida Turnpike immediately to the east (Exit 58). The bridge is used by residents and visitors who: connect from W Sunrise to University Drive (via 65th Avenue and NW 5th St.) and vise versa; connect from W Sunrise to Broward Blvd (via 65th Avenue and NW 70th Ave); and access neighborhoods within the area.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Successful relocation of the utility lines affixed to the bridge. Measured by: Project finishing on schedule, FDOT getting cleared to begin project, minimum service disruptions, and water quality of the C-12 canal.
