14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The funds will be used to construct a 7000 sq. ft. classroom/building to allow BBTC to offer a new postsecondary Firefighter/EMT program, a dual enrolled Public Safety Telecommunications program and to expand the current Commercial Vehicle Driving program. In addition to construction costs for the new building, there is a need for a driving pad for the Firefighter/EMT and CVD programs and equipment purchases for both Firefighter/EMT and the Public Safety Telecommunications programs. The new pad will increase the ability to train qualified CDL Class A operators.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The construction of the new facility will allow 2 new and 1 expanded CTE postsecondary program to be offered on the BBTC campus. These offerings will expand career opportunities for students in the region. Additionally, House Bill 3 from the 2022 session encourages school districts to expand offerings in 911 public safety telecommunication training programs for high school students interested in developing skills necessary to perform as a public safety dispatcher or 911 operator. BBTC will offer the 911 operator program as a dual enrolled program which will allow high school students to take the program free of charge.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

In addition to the opportunity for students to have different career training opportunities, BBTC will produce firefighter graduates that will handle residential, commercial and wildfires and is an investment in the safety and health for our community. The training of 911 operators will serve all facets of public safety within the region.

The program graduates will fill vacancies within the region which will in turn provide lifesaving services within the region. Additionally, the community has a need to re-employ/retrain a large sector due to closing of the Georgia Pacific Mill. Employed community members will help with the projected economic impact the community will have with the mill and subsequent supporting industries.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Postsecondary technical college students. 30-50 students per year. Additionally, displaced workers from the recent closure of the Georgia Pacific Mill and supporting industries will be targeted for enrollment.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

BBTC will be able to offer two additional Career and Technical Education programs and expand an existing offering. This training is not offered within the region and will Increase opportunities career seekers.
